ACE 99 Opened

The Annual Convention and Exhibition (Acronymed ACE) of 1999 of the IEEE India Council which happily is the 25th, was opened in a colourful function at the Amphitheatre of Electronic Research and Development Centre, Trivandrum at 5.30 PM on 02 December 1999 by Shri. P. J. Joseph, Minister for Eduction and Works, Kerala. In the absence of IC Chairman Dr. A. K Aggarwal, Prof. V. K. Damodaran, Member IC, presided over the historic function.

Shri. P. J. Joseph dwelled deep into the significance of the theme of the Conference viz. Intelligent Networking and reflected on the implications of the frontier technologies in the field of pedagogy, research, quality of life etc. and exhorted the engineers under the banner of IEEE to do science and technology in the days to come, for meeting the spiralling expectations of the masses. He predicted that the next millennium may need only lesser number of teachers and class rooms, but astounding strides in the area of distance learning are quite possible. The changes that are going to take place in the beginning of the next millenium in the arena of trade is mind boggling and is of great consequence to the less developed countries, he reminded. The Minister also wanted the professionals under the IEEE to be of help to the governments in developing countries to sort out issues related to Information Technology applications for increasing productivity, social welfare and better wealth creation. India, he was sure, has enormous intellectual capital in this field and therefore he requested the professionals to invest them in nation building at this crucial juncture. Prof. V K Damodaran, in his presidential address, conveyed the regrets from the IC Chairman for his inability to reach Trivandrum and read out an e-mail message prepared by the Chairman, who traced the history of IEEE's growth, ever since eminent men like Edison and Graham Bell instituted this globally acclaimed and acknowledged professional society. The message also stated that the Mission of India Council is to see that our engineers contribute in an equal measure to the generation of new knowledge, to the design of new products and to the technological developments in the world. It is not an easy task. But, we shall not be able to generate wealth for our society otherwise, he added. Prof. Damodaran further told the audience that the theme Intelligent Networking is in furtherance of the IEEE slogan `Networking the World'. Intelligent Networking should make it possible to make networking more efficient and economical and time effective in meeting the needs and the ever increasing aspirations of the people. Technologists have the responsibility of helping to meet such needs in the most effective way.

Er. Sathish Babu of CSI, Er. N M Kumar of IETE and Er.R P Nair of Institution of Engineers (India), as representatives of the sister professional Societies, offered felicitations. Er. Koruthu P. Varughese, Chairman, Organising Committee presented the highlights of the Conference. Er. Muraleemohan Lal, Kerala Section Chair, welcomed the invitees and the gathering. Prof. N. Chandrasekharan, Director, C-DAC, Bangalore gave the key note on Technology Indian Options in e-Business, e- Commerce and e-Governance. He took the audience to a new height with his excellent presentation. Dr. P.S. Chandra mohanan Nair, Secretary, Kerala Section proposed Vote of Thanks. Earlier in the day, two tutorials on Java and E-Commerce were conducted, which were very well attended. On the Second day, the proceedings were held at Technopark. The Executive Vice-Chairman of IC Committee Er. P.K.Srivastava and Vice Chair (Professional Activities) Er. R. Muralidharan joined the conference. A number of contributed and invited papers are being presented. The Valedictory address of ACE 99 is expected to be given by the IEEE President Dr. Kenneth R Laker. This contest is organized in memory of Mr. M. V. Chauhan, Past Region 10 Director, who left us on April 10, 1991. He was instrumental in giving a big thrust to the Students activities in the IEEE. During his period, both the Madras Section and the Region 10, with twenty-two and one hundred Student Branches respectively, occupied the first position in the world.

The first Contest was held in August 1992. In addition to three prizes of Rs. 2500, 1500 and 1000, the first prize winner is invited to present his/her paper at the Annual Convention and Exhibition (ACE) of the IEEE India Council.

For the Contest this year, thirty-one papers from twelve Institutions were received. Three Professors evaluated each Paper. Distinguished Lecture by Prof. Rangachar Kasturi

Prof Rangachar Kasturi, Professor of Computer Science and Engineering at the Pennsylvania State University, USA, delivered a lecture entitiled `Video Segmentation for Indexing: Methods and their Performance Evaluation' at the Electrical Engineering seminar hall at IIT, Bombay on the 26th Oct as a part of the Tata Infotech distinguished lecture series. The lecture was attended by the Tata Infotech personnel as well as the student and research community in IIT. Prof Kasturi talked about the work done in the area of Video segmentation at the Pennsylvania state university in the last five years. This included a project done for NASA, in which a system was developed for an artificially generated view for pilots flying supersonic passenger aircrafts. The reason for developing such a system is that the nose of a supersonic aircraft is very long and it obstructs the pilot's view. Prof. Kasturi also touched upon the various techniques used for detecting scene changes in video and other methods for identifying key frames. These key frames are used in the indexing of video.
