

#### VISIT TO DELHI

Mrs Marry Ellen Laker W/o Dr. Laker and Ms. Emily Adler D/o Dr. Adler accompanied the delegation.

The first engagement for the delegation was arranged at India International Centre at 1730 Hrs. The function covered welcome to TAB colloquia by the Section, meeting with Delhi Section Executive Committee members, a presentation by Dr. Laker titled

The IEEE Fostering Technological Innovation, enabling Members Career and promoting community World wide". It was followed by Open house discussions with Section members. The Open House highlighted the following issues :

1. As most of the members in India fall in "Minimum Income Group" and are eligible to pay only 50% dues for IEEE membership, GOLD programme is not suitable for this country in the present form. To attract members for GOLD programme IEEE may consider allowing double concession. I. E. first reduced dues for GOLD membership and then Minimum Income Group concession of 50%.
2. Like IEE Sections, may be allowed to collect membership fee in Indian Rupees especially from students.
3. It was clarified that in case an application for a "Fellow" is not approved in one go, it should be made again. In fact there is no restriction on number of times an individual can be nominated for a Fellow.

It was highlighted that for the first time in the history of Delhi Section, the membership has crossed 1000 mark. In fact as on 31st August 99, Section membership stands at 1565.

Dr. Vijay Bhargava, distinguished Lecturer in Communications joined the Colloquia during its visit to Delhi College of Engineering (DCE) on the morning of 20th September. IEEE and IEE student Chapters welcomed the TAB Colloquia, IEEE & IEE Delhi section members to DCE.

The delegation interacted with the Principal and Faculty from Electrical, Electronics, Communication and Computer Science Engineering. Following talks were delivered by TAB Colloquia members :

1. Life Long Learning for Engineers in the 21st Century by IEEE President Dr. Laker.
2. Electronics in Power Utility Systems by Dr. Spencer
3. High Density Interconnect Packaging by Dr. Adler. During the interactive Session with student Branch office bearers, a presentation of Student Branch CD was made, featuring Troika an annual event of the college, which is attended by students from various Engineering Colleges in India.

Students addressed the following issues to the Colloquia :

- Students pointed out that IEEE student membership fee is US\$ 14 against IEE's Pound 2. -
- Can IEEE have Student Exchange Programme between DCE & Universities abroad ? - Can IEEE help DCE in expanding the participation level of "Troika" outside India?

The programme ended at 1430 Hrs, on 20th followed by a short sight seeing trip. The TAB Colloquia delegation left for Ahmedabad on 21st Sep 99 morning.

### Multimedia Microwave Cooker

A microwave cooker that surfs the Internet, pays bills, transfers money, orders weekly shopping and can be used to watch television-while the dinner is being cooked-has been unveiled as the 'must have' multimedia appliance for today's home.

The pioneering, prototype equipment developed by the United Kingdom-based branch of NCR, the international banking services and equipment supplier may be in the shops in 18 months and hopes to revolutionize banking and electronic commerce by capitalizing on the familiarity and time-saving features of the microwave cooker.

The appliance's special features include touch-sensitive screen technology in the door, a built-in Internet browser and a television (TV) card. These allow the user to: perform banking transactions including payment of bills, money transfer and loan applications. shop online through the World Wide Web send e-mails by dictating a message into the voice-activated technology and by simply pushing a button, turn the door into TV screen.
